Exciting News: Aspire Enhances Safety with 9 New AEDs Across Our Services







We're proud to share that Aspire has taken a significant step forward in ensuring the safety and well-being of the people we support, their families, and our staff. Thanks to the generous support of the Richmond Community Foundation and Drive for Ability, we have acquired 9 Automated External Defibrillators (AEDs) along with secure cabinets, which will soon be installed across several Aspire locations:

- Seedlings Early Childhood Development Hub
- Transitions
- Synergy/Respite/Independent Living/Home Share office
- Quantum
- Avenues/Employment Services/Outreach office
- Four of our Supported Living homes

Most Aspire staff are already trained in First Aid, including the use of AEDs. In addition, they will receive specific training on the operation of our new AED model to ensure confidence and readiness in any emergency.

At Aspire, we are deeply committed to creating safe, supportive environments. With the addition of these AEDs, we've made our spaces even safer. And we're not stopping here—our goal is to eventually have AEDs in every Aspire location.

Celebrating National Indigenous Peoples Day

Congratulations to everyone who participated, especially those doing it for the first time this year!












Leon and Shawn volunteer at Church on Five
